

Step One

Find an example in your novel where the author is building tension by

- Using a setting to create a mood allowing the reader to predict
- Setting up an expectation through foreshadowing in the plot allowing the reader to predict
- Setting up obstacles which complicate the plot

Step Two

Write a paragraph explaining and supporting how the author builds tension in the novel. Provide evidence quoted from the text to support your idea.

Paragraph Structure

Topic Sentence: the statement that tells the readers what the rest of the paragraph will be talking about (Include title/author)

Evidence: Explain by using a quote that proves or illustrates what you claimed in your topic sentence.

Relevance: After the quote, show how it supports your point or idea; this will be in your own words and will demonstrate the connection between your idea and the quote you've used. It will explain to the reader why you chose the quote that you did and why it is relevant to your main point; the quote does not make your point for you. Do not end a paragraph with a quote.
