Step One (THINKING)

1. Consider the narrative perspective in the novel you're reading. (first person, second person, third person objective, limited or omniscient)
2. What point of view has the author chosen and why?
3. Think about how this narrative perspective has been chosen in order to:
 - a. establish dramatic irony which results in suspense, humor, or lesson
 - b. establish a plot structure in which an unreliable narrator presents a story that will set readers up for a plot twist
 - c. establish a strong reader identification with the protagonist as a reliable narrator so the reader will root for his or her to overcome conflicts.
 - d. Objectively present facts in order to...
 - e. Allow readers to know how characters feel about each other or situations because...
 - f. Other (Discuss with Mrs. Meese prior to writing)

Step Two (COMMUNICATING YOUR THINKING)

Write a paragraph about how the author's choice of POV affect the way the story is presented to readers? Those ways are listed under number 3 on step one.

Paragraph Structure

Topic Sentence: the statement that tells the readers what the rest of the paragraph will be talking about (Include title/author) *Italicize book titles.*

Evidence: Explain by paraphrasing in your own words to illustrate what you claimed in your topic sentence.

Relevance: Explain how your evidence supports your point or idea; this will be in your own words and will demonstrate the connection between your idea and your evidence. This is the "so what" part.

Strong Evidence (3 pts.)

Inconsistent or No Evidence (1 pt)

Reading LT: I can analyze how the point of view contributes to its meaning and style.

Writing LT: I can produce clear and coherent writing in which the development, organization, and style are appropriate to task, purpose, and audience.

— Paragraph follows appropriate structure by introducing the main idea in a topic sentence that includes title/author. *Italicize book titles.*

— Paragraph follows appropriate structure by including paraphrased material as your evidence.

— Paragraph follows appropriate structure by including a concluding sentence that explains to the reader why the **evidence** is relevant to your main point.

Conventions (rules) of capitalization, spelling, grammar and punctuation are followed.
